Session Teams and their Purpose:

Communications Team

The purpose of the Communications Team is to ensure that methods of communication remain open and available between the Minister and Session and the Congregation and Community. Primarily, this means overseeing administration of the church's website and social media. The Communications Team is responsible for creating and maintaining an operations manual that details how Bethel's website and social media pages are organized and administered, and ensuring that this information is readily available and accessible to the Session. The Communications Team is also responsible for identifying volunteers who may be appointed by Session to assist in administering the church's website and/or social media pages.

It is not the Communications Team's role to determine the "message" to be communicated by the church. This job belongs to the Minister and to the other Teams in the Session (Faith, Fellowship, Finance, Personnel, Property, Service, and Study,). As such, it is expected that the Communications Team will work closely with each of the other Teams to ensure that each of these groups has access to prompt and effective means of communication.

Within the first six months of the Communications Team's formation, it is expected that members of the Communications Team will meet with each of the current volunteers who assist in Bethel's website and social media pages and determine whether these volunteers are interested in continuing their work in their present roles. If they are not, the Communications Team will determine whether new volunteers are needed, and if so, the Communications Team will locate individuals willing to volunteer in these roles. The Communications Team will then make a recommendation to Session as to which volunteer positions are needed ("Website Administrator," "Facebook Administrator," "Instagram Administrator"), and who is willing to volunteer for these roles. Session may, at its discretion, appoint volunteers to serve in any or all of these capacities.

Faith Team

This team assists the Pastor in worship preparation and special services planning. Members are drawn from the choir, the church musician, and interested volunteers. This team also oversees advertisements in the local news media in coordination with the Communications Team. The Faith Team ensures there are candles and decor for worship, complementary music, communion elements and servers as well as liturgists, ushers and acolytes.

Fellowship Team

This team is there to serve Bethel members and members of the community by providing a warm, caring place in the midst of the busy workings of the world. Meals, celebrations, outings and picnics, holiday gatherings, receptions and showers and recognition of accomplishments fall into the loving hands of this team. While everyone loves to celebrate the good times, Family and Fellowship can also be counted on to support our members and community when things are not going well during bereavement or illness. Just like the home provides food and encouragement to its family, Family and Fellowship provides comfort and nourishment to help our members carry out Bethel's mission in the Christian world.

Finance & Stewardship Team

This team is responsible for the stewardship of the church's finances, including receipts coming into the church and the spending of those receipts. The team insures that church financial resources are managed and recorded appropriately through developing financial procedures and controls, monitoring the budget, managing cash, investments and debt, and overseeing financial records, reports, personnel (volunteer Treasurer, counters, and paid staff), and annual reviews. The team provides support, as needed, to the volunteers and staff and assists in producing useful reports for the Session and Congregation. The team calls attention to the financial needs of the church to carry out ministries and missions, as needed. The team consists of: at least one or two elders currently on Session, the Church Treasurer, and at large members with an aptitude or interest in financial matters.

Personnel Team

This team serves as the church human resources group for both paid staff and volunteers. In cooperation with the pastor and teams with whom the staff and volunteers work, it develops accurate job descriptions, defines job duties, ensures adequate training, recommends compensation and benefits, performs annual reviews, and helps set annual developmental goals. When job openings occur, the team develops the job description, advertises the position, reviews applicants and assists in the interview process. The Team recommends for employment all staff except the Pastor, who is recommended by a Pastor Nominating Committee. The team is responsible for creating and administering all personnel policies and procedures that the Session adopts and for reviewing and updating the Personnel Policies & Procedures section of the Church Operating Manual annually. The policies and procedures include hiring and terminations, annual reviews, grievances, compensation & benefits, and training, as well and other personnel related matters.

Property Team

This team is responsible for keeping the facilities and grounds properly maintained and in good repair. This includes everything from making sure the pianos are tuned to painting the walls.

Landscape: This group maintains and improves the already beautiful grounds including the Memorial Garden, Labyrinth, and Pet Memorial Garden.

Service Team

Bethel's Service Team supports local and global missions through direct service and financial support. Local ministries include organizing and hosting the Kingston Lakeside Farmers Market, providing food to the Hands of Mercy food pantry, hosting free Laundry Night events, volunteering at events hosted by the Roane County Cooperative Ministries, assisting homeless families through Family Promise of Roane County, serving 2-3 meals per year at the Rockwood "Love Kitchen", preparing Christmas baskets for ~50 families each year, "adopting" counselors at Camp John Knox, delivering collected household items to the Sunset Gap community, and providing service and communion to prisoners. Global ministries include supporting Grace School in Kenya, hosting International Peacemakers, and overseeing four special offerings collected each year (One Great Hour of Sharing, Pentecost, Peace & Global Witness, and Christmas Joy). The Bethel Service Team also hosts occasional mission trips.

Study Team

This team seeks to support the vision of Bethel by providing guidance and direction to children, youth and adults in their faith journey through Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, Confirmation classes, summer camp and retreats, Small and Mighty events, and intergenerational events. The youth collect the "Souper Bowl" offering on Super Bowl Sunday, which is donated to a local project of the youth's choosing (e.g., the RCCM Garden Grant Program, Laundry Love, Love Kitchen Bingo, etc.).

This team also provides opportunities for adults to begin/continue their faith journey through Sunday School classes and special study groups such as Lenten studies, Advent studies and new member classes.
